





## QUALIFICATIONS

If the candidate indicates that he/she does not qualify, the filing officer shall decline his/her declaration of candidacy. (Utah Code Section 20A-9-201, 202)

### UTAH STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Utah Code 20A-9-201, 20A-14-103

- Registered voter in the board district from which the member is elected or appointed

- Non-partisan

There are basic principles of decency, honesty, and fair play which every candidate for public office in the State of Utah has a moral obligation to observe and uphold, in order that, after vigorously contested but fairly conducted campaigns, our citizens may exercise their right to a free election, and that the will of the people may be fully and clearly expressed on the issues.

**THEREFORE:**

**I SHALL** conduct my campaign openly and publicly, discussing the issues as I see them, presenting my record and policies with sincerity and frankness, and criticizing, without fear or favor, the record and policies of my opponents that I believe merit criticism.

**I SHALL NOT** use nor shall I permit the use of scurrilous attacks on any candidate or the candidate's immediate family. I shall not participate in or nor shall I permit the use of defamation, libel, or slander against any candidate or the candidate's immediate family. I shall not participate in nor shall I permit the use of any other criticism of any candidate or the candidate's immediate family that I do not believe to be truthful, provable, and relevant to my campaign.

**I SHALL NOT** use nor shall I permit the use of any practice that tends to corrupt or undermine our American system of free elections, or that hinders or prevents the free expression of the will of the voters, including practices intended to hinder or prevent any eligible person from registering to vote or voting.

**I SHALL NOT** coerce election help or campaign contributions for myself or for any other candidate from my employees or volunteers.

**I SHALL** immediately and publicly repudiate support deriving from any individual or group which resorts, on behalf of my candidacy or in opposition to that of an opponent, to methods in violation of the letter or spirit of this pledge. I shall accept responsibility to take firm action against any subordinate who violates any provision of this pledge or the laws governing elections.

**I SHALL** defend and uphold the right of every qualified American voter to full and equal participation in the electoral process.

I, the undersigned, candidate for election to public office in the State of Utah, hereby voluntarily endorse, subscribe to, and solemnly pledge myself to conduct my campaign in accordance with the above principles and practices.

REPORT

The Commission on the Judicial Branch was organized by the Governor of Tennessee in 1991 to study the structure and administration of the judicial branch of the state government. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from judges, lawyers, laymen, and laywomen. The Commission has also conducted extensive research into the various issues that have been raised. The Commission believes that the following recommendations will improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the judicial branch of the state government.

The Commission believes that the most important recommendation is the creation of a judicial council. The judicial council would be responsible for the selection, discipline, and removal of judges. The council would also be responsible for the administration of the judicial branch, including the budget and the management of the courts. The council would be composed of members from the judicial branch, the executive branch, and the legislature.

The Commission also believes that it is important to improve the selection process for judges. The current process is based on the recommendation of the Tennessee Judicial Nominating Commission. The Commission believes that a more open and competitive process would be better. The Commission recommends that the Governor be given the authority to appoint judges from a list of candidates submitted by a judicial council.

The Commission also believes that it is important to improve the administration of the courts. The Commission recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to create new courts and to eliminate existing courts that are no longer needed. The Commission also recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to set the rules of procedure for the courts.

The Commission also believes that it is important to improve the education and training of judges. The Commission recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to create a judicial academy. The academy would be responsible for the education and training of judges. The academy would also be responsible for the continuing education of judges.

The Commission also believes that it is important to improve the public's understanding of the judicial branch. The Commission recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to create a public information program. The program would be responsible for educating the public about the judicial branch and the role of judges.

The Commission also believes that it is important to improve the access to the courts. The Commission recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to create a public defender system. The system would be responsible for providing legal representation to indigent defendants. The Commission also recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to create a public defender system for civil cases.

The Commission also believes that it is important to improve the efficiency of the courts. The Commission recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to create a judicial council on court administration. The council would be responsible for studying the efficiency of the courts and for recommending ways to improve it. The Commission also recommends that the judicial council be given the authority to create a judicial council on judicial administration. The council would be responsible for studying the administration of the courts and for recommending ways to improve it.
