2014 REGULAR GENERAL ELECTION

I, Spencer J. Cox, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Utah, in accordance with Utah Code Section 20A-5-101, do hereby notify each County Clerk that:

1. attached is a list of the offices to be filled at the regular general election to be held in the State of Utah on Tuesday, November 4, 2014;
2. attached is the Master Ballot Position List and written procedures for election officials to use the List;
3. attached is a list of filing fees, and;
4. the Declaration of Candidacy filing period for these offices begins on Friday, March 14, 2014 and ends at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, March 20, 2014.

1. FEDERAL

- a. **U.S. House of Representatives.** One Representative for a two (2) year term in each of the following U.S. Congressional Districts:
 - i. First District. The First Congressional District consists of Box Elder, Cache, Daggett, part of Davis, Duchesne, Morgan, Rich, Summit, Uintah, and Weber Counties.
 - ii. Second District. The Second Congressional District consists of Beaver, part of Davis, Garfield, Iron, part of Juab, Kane, Millard, Piute, part of Salt Lake, part of Sanpete, Sevier, Tooele, Washington, and Wayne Counties.
 - iii. Third District. The Third Congressional District consists of Carbon, Emery, Grand, part of Salt Lake, San Juan, part of Utah, and Wasatch Counties.
 - iv. Fourth District. The Fourth Congressional District is located in Juab, part of Salt Lake, part of Sanpete, and part of Utah Counties.

2. STATE

- a. **State Executive.** The following position will be elected for a two (2) year term:
 - i. Attorney General.
- b. **State Senate.** One member for a four (4) year term from each of the following state senate districts:
 - i. District Two (2) is located in Salt Lake County.
 - ii. District Three (3) is located in Salt Lake County.
 - iii. District Four (4) is located in Salt Lake County.
 - iv. District Five (5) is located in Salt Lake County.
 - v. District Nine (9) is located in Salt Lake County.
 - vi. District Eleven (11) is located in Salt Lake and Utah Counties.

- vii. District Twelve (12) is located in Salt Lake and Tooele Counties.
- viii. District Fifteen (15) is located in Utah County.
- ix. District Seventeen (17) is located in Box Elder, Cache and Tooele Counties.
- x. District Eighteen (18) is located in Davis, Morgan and Weber Counties.
- xi. District Twenty-one (21) is located in Davis County.
- xii. District Twenty-two (22) is located in Davis County.
- xiii. District Twenty-six (26) is located in Daggett, Duchesne, Summit, Uintah and Wasatch Counties.
- xiv. District Twenty-eight (28) consists of Beaver, Iron and Washington Counties.

c. State House of Representatives. One member of the Utah House of Representatives for a two (2) year term from each of the seventy-five (75) state legislative districts.

d. State Board of Education. One member for a four (4) year term from each of the following State School Districts: 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 9, and 14.

- i. District One (1) is located in Box Elder, Cache, Morgan, Rich and Weber Counties.
- ii. District Two (2) is located in Weber County.
- iii. District Three (3) is located in Juab, Salt Lake and Tooele Counties.
- iv. District Five (5) is located in Davis and Salt Lake Counties.
- v. District Six (6) is located in Salt Lake County.
- vi. District Nine (9) is located in Utah County.
- vii. District Fourteen (14) is located in Beaver, Carbon, Emery, Garfield, Grand, Kane, Millard, Piute, San Juan, Sanpete, Sevier, Utah and Wayne Counties.

- e. **Local Boards of Education.** Members of the local boards of education should be elected as determined by individual school boards or districts.

3. JUDICIAL

- a. **Supreme Court.** There will be an unopposed retention election for three (3) Supreme Court Judges, provided that the incumbent(s) whose term is expiring files during the filing period.
- b. **Court of Appeals.** There will be an unopposed retention election for six (6) Court of Appeals Judges, provided that the incumbent(s) whose term is expiring files during the filing period.
- c. **District Court.** There will be a retention election for thirty (30) District Court Judges in the following districts, provided that the incumbent(s) whose term is expiring files during the filing period:
 - i. First District. Two (2) Judges in the First Judicial District, which consists of Box Elder, Cache, and Rich Counties.
 - ii. Second District. Five (5) Judges in the Second Judicial District, which consists of Davis, Morgan, and Weber Counties.
 - iii. Third District. Thirteen (13) Judges in the Third Judicial District, which consists of Salt Lake, Summit, and Tooele Counties.
 - iv. Fourth District. Six (6) Judges in the Fourth Judicial District, which consists of Juab, Millard, Utah, and Wasatch Counties.
 - v. Fifth District. One (1) Judge in the Fifth Judicial District, which consists of Beaver, Iron, and Washington Counties.
 - vi. Sixth District. One (1) Judge in the Sixth Judicial District, which consists of Garfield, Kane, Piute, Sanpete, Sevier, and Wayne Counties.
 - vii. Seventh District. One (1) Judge in the Seventh Judicial District, which consists of Carbon, Emery, Grand and San Juan Counties.
 - viii. Eighth District. One (1) Judge in the Eighth Judicial District, which consists of Daggett, Duchesne, and Uintah Counties.

- d. Juvenile Court.** There will be a retention election for nine (9) Juvenile Court Judges in the following districts, provided that the incumbent(s) whose term is expiring files during the filing period:
- i. First District. One (1) Judge in the First Judicial District, which consists of Box Elder, Cache, and Rich Counties.
 - ii. Second District. Three (3) Judge in the Second Judicial District, which consists of Davis, Morgan, and Weber Counties.
 - iii. Third District. Two (2) Judges in the Third Judicial District, which consists of Salt Lake, Summit, and Tooele Counties.
 - iv. Fifth District. One (1) Judge in the Fifth Judicial District, which consists of Beaver, Iron, and Washington Counties.
 - v. Seventh District. Two (2) Judges in the Seventh Judicial District, which consists of Carbon, Emery, Grand and San Juan Counties.
- e. Justice Court.** Any Justice Court judge whose term is expiring shall be subject to an unopposed retention election in the county or counties in which the court to which the judge is appointed is located.

4. COUNTY

County offices up for election are to be determined by the county's form of government.

5. BALLOT PROPOSITION

As of the date of this notice, no ballot proposition has qualified for the 2014 general election ballot.

6. MASTER BALLOT POSITION LIST, RANDOM SELECTION, PROCEDURES

In accordance with Utah Code Section 20A-6-305, Utah Lieutenant Governor Spencer J. Cox hereby establishes the Master Ballot Position List, establishes written procedures for election officials to use the Master Ballot Position List, establishes written procedures for the Lieutenant Governor in conducting the randomization in a fair manner, and provides a record of the random selection process used.

b. Written procedures for election officials to use the master ballot position list.

In accordance with Utah Code Section 20A-6-305, election officers shall use the master ballot position list for the current year and the next year (2014-2015) to determine the order in which to list candidates on the ballot for any election held during those years.

To determine the order in which to list candidates on the ballot, the election officer shall apply the randomized alphabet using: the candidate's surname; for candidates with a surname that has the same spelling, the candidate's given name; if the ballot provides for a ticket or a straight party ticket, the name of the registered political party. This does not apply to an election for an office for which only one candidate is listed on the ballot or a judicial retention election under Section 20A-12-201.

c. Written procedures for the Lieutenant Governor in conducting the randomization in a fair manner and record of the random selection process used.

In accordance with Utah Code Section 20A-6-305, the Lieutenant Governor's Office conducted the randomization process by using a random alphabet generator utility in the statewide voter database application VISTA (voter information & state tracking application). The randomization was done on Friday, January 24, 2014 in the presence of witnesses representing the political parties in Utah.
