## Qualifications:

Ben McAdams represents Utah Senate District 2 in the Utah State Legislature. McAdams also works as a senior advisor to Salt Lake City Mayor Ralph Becker.

Ben's work with Mayor Becker and in the legislature has provided him with experience bridging divides on difficult issues. Working with Becker, Ben was instrumental in securing funding for the construction of the Airport TRAX line and for the reconstruction of the North Temple viaduct. He played a key role in facilitating passage of Salt Lake City's nondiscrimination ordinances and spearheaded City efforts to protect the Bonneville Shoreline Preserve, located above City Creek Canyon, by opposing a gas pipeline that was proposed to run through the natural open space.

McAdams graduated from the University of Utah and received his law degree from Columbia Law School. Although not currently practicing law, Ben maintains his connection to the law as an adjunct professor at the S.J. Quinney College of Law at the University of Utah.

Ben is married to Julie Judd, who is also a graduate of Columbia Law School and works as an attorney in the Office of General at the University of Utah. They live in Salt Lake City with their three children.
